

If we come to Christ repent and confess our sins to Him, what will Jesus do with the hard heart of sin?

Read Ezekiel 36:25-27, 29.

Write the Bible Answer:

The Lord Jesus will cleanse you; He will give you a new heart; He will save you. But in this you have a part to act. What you must do is surrender your life to Jesus. You must allow God to work in your heart. Whatever changes God reveals you have to make in your life through the power of Christ you must do it.

Whatever you think, do, say, or listen to should be according to the Bible standard. If it is not true, honest, just, pure, lovely, of good report it must be cut off. The worldly movies and worldly music such as rap, hip hop, rock, jazz and R&B promote all of the things God hates - sin. So can I, professing to love God, love these things? Absolutely not, for if we love things of the world we become an enemy of God. (Read James 4:4) These things must be let go.

Are you sleep in sin? What time is it?

Read Romans 13:11-14.

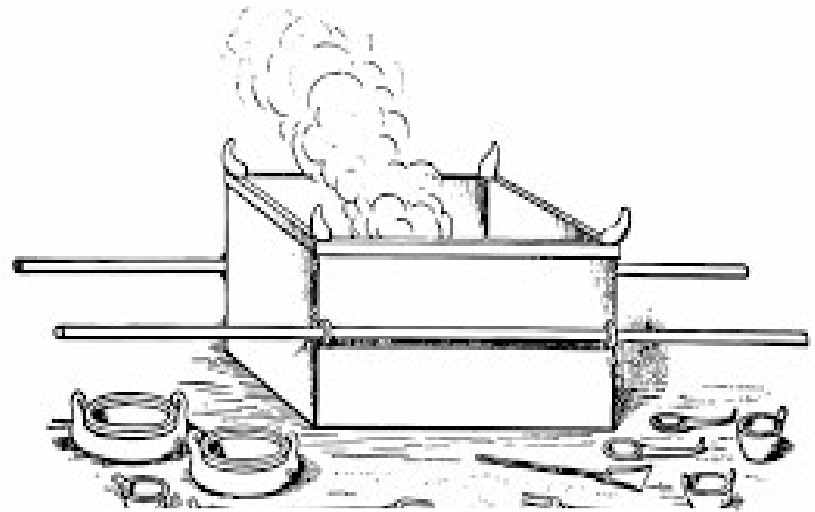
Write the Bible Answer:

Now it is high time. Do not put off giving your life to Christ down the road, give it to Him now. Cast off the works of darkness, cut off all the avenues of the sinful flesh.

Will you surrender your all? Surrender your life totally to Christ Today.

The Sacrifice



When a person walked into the sanctuary, the first thing they would come upon is the altar of offering or in other words the altar of sacrifice. (Read Exodus 40:29.)

What happened daily upon this altar?

Read Exodus 29:38-39; Leviticus 4:27-29; Leviticus 4:3-4; Leviticus 5:7.

Write the Bible Answer:

Note: Upon this altar were offered lambs, goats, oxen. Daily the sins of the people were symbolically transferred from the sinner to the innocent Lamb which had to die. The sinner would have to come and bring the young spotless lamb that had done nothing wrong; but because he had sinned the lamb had to die. The sinner would bring his lamb to the temple, come before the altar, lay his hands upon the innocent lamb (symbolically transferring his sins to the lamb), then the lamb would die.

Why did the lamb have to die?

Well, God had this to teach us lessons. The death of the lamb reveals that sin causes death. If you had to kill a lamb when you sinned, would you want to sin? No. Sin causes death. Also, the lamb reveals hope. Jesus Christ, as the Lamb of God, took our place so we do not have to die.

Could these offerings cleanse them from sin?

Read Hebrews 10:1-4; Hebrews 9:9-10.

Write the Bible Answer:

The blood of the lambs, oxen, goats, offered could never take away sin. It was only “a shadow of the things to come.” When you walk in light you have a shadow, but that shadow is not you. Your shadow shows an outline of what you look like but this only gives an idea of what you really look like. These offerings “shadowed” the One who would come and die for the sins of the world to give us an understanding of what Jesus Christ does for us.

Lambs and goat could not die for the sins of the world, so who was represented in the offerings of the sanctuary?

Read John 1:29; Hebrews 10:3-7, 10-12; Hebrews 9:24-28.

Write the Bible Answer:

Note: These offerings were a constant reminder of the Lamb of God which would take away the sins of the world, and pointed to Jesus as the Lamb of God who would die for the sins of the world. He died once. He was once offered to bare the sins of the world. He resurrected, and will come again to receive those who accept His gift that is offered, those who love and obey

Him. When Christ was offered for our sins, all these services and sacrifices were to end because we no longer needed a “shadow” when Jesus revealed salvation.

Redeemed with Blood

Read 1 Peter 1:18-21.

Jesus shed His blood for you. He died to give you life. He the righteous God lowered Himself and took the form of man and died to save us from sin.

1 John 4:9-10 “In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. 10 Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son *to be* the propitiation for our sins.” The Lamb has died for the sins of the world. God has made a provision for you to be saved.

What is your part in the sacrifice?

Jesus the Lamb of God has died for the sins of the world. Even though the offering has been made, as in the offerings of old, the sinner would have to place his hands on the victim and confess his sins, thus symbolically transferring his sins to the lamb. Similarly, when we come to Christ we have something we must surrender.

When we come to Christ what must we surrender?

Read James 1:21.

Write the Bible Answer:

We must let go of sin and give it to Christ. Lay it down. Why?

Read Romans 8:13.

Write the Bible Answer:

Sin is bondage.

Read John 8:34.

Who can set us free?

John 8:31-32, 36.

Write the Bible Answer:

Jesus can set you free from the bondage of sin – which leads to everlasting death – and change you into the servant of God – which leads to holiness and everlasting life.
